# National First-Gen Statistics



- **24%** First-generation students graduate at a rate of 24% versus 59% for continuing-generation students.
- 54% There are 8.2 million first-generation undergraduate students; 54% of all undergraduate in the U.S.
- **72%** By 2031, 72% of jobs in the U.S. will require postsecondary education or training.
- 65% Of students at Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs) are first-generation
- **62%** Of students who are veterans are first-generation students


