




## Map a meaningful context: From the past into.....

Life Map / Mind Map

- 1) Key Concepts vs key experiences
- 2) Interpretation of experiences (in the classroom... or as part of the assignment)
- 3) Use Colors, lines and diagrams
- 4) The possibility of including a FUTURE MAP
- 5) Include clear guidelines (achievements, photos, descriptions...)

Keywords: opportunity, empowerment, choices, philanthropy, global, self-confidence, passion, girls and women, adventure, risk, failure, education, poverty, tenacity, freedom



Tool 1:

The **What**: we are learning something: STUDY SKILLS

The **So What** of the learning: Since I have learned this what insights do I get?

The **Now What** of the learning: I know something useful, I know why it is useful, but I need to find an application: a behavior to change / and improvement to make.

This is a debrief framework for any experience: a visit to the library, career center...



Tool 2:

Always use an ice breaker to create a more fun, social, and safe environment

Peer Mentors can help you very much if you let them. Debrief with them at the end of the session and give feedback. How did it go? What would you do differently?



Tool 3:

Bring humor to the classroom

If you cannot tell jokes... maybe other people can

You can use fun resources to help people laugh a bit



Tool 4:

Invite people to share during your class: Writing Center, Library, Career Center, Success Center...

Get students to take notes

Get students to ask questions

Provide a summary at the end of the session



Tool 5:

Get people to pair share / group share and report on activities: they do most of the talking – you do less talking


Ask people to come up with ideas to solve something... for instance overcoming procrastination


They need to come up with three different ideas and select the best and think about the value of that idea... what makes that ideas more effective

Share with other, document and share




Tool 6: Effects Wheel ... an exploration for leverage points








#### Effects Wheel ... an exploration for leverage points





When you reach 2 or 3 level consequences: select the positive and negative ones that are most likely to happen

Generate 2 different ideas to make it happen or to avoid it



Tool 7: Bring variety to the classroom:

- 1) Cognitive activity: learning about well-being
- 2) Social activity: get them to interview each other or other people about well-being
- 3) Emotional activity: debrief how they felt about it... did they help them learn in a different way.

Measure the amount of information people are using.... Measure the level of connection between people.... Measure the level of trust and relationship building...

Use every opportunity to bring one Aggie core value and make connections of how we can belong through leadership and service




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
